1. AFTER TME PURRIRR

Some idoa of the reactions of the German soldilar to the deatin OI HIMTER and the aocession of DOHITV vas gained by a survey of FW oplnion 1 n the oage. A random Geoum of 100 PW was questioned with rosultis shown bolow, and from the officers'pon four ware seloctod, two full Colonels and two Naval Lieutenant-Cormanders.

To take the offlcers first, all foun had heard the new, ne Colonel saying "A horoic life has come to its end," Their reactions to the event varied but ware surpx.singly apethetic. One Colonol thought that'HITLER's doatin was not a disastor, as DONITK, who is a capable man, will act in a soldterly menner wi the soldterly inetinot. The other colonel was nore restigned and foresar tho possibililty of Civil Mar, tho SS Pichting against othor groups and partios. Of the Jioutonant-Commanders, one disclaimed any intorest in or lenomlodge of politios but eventually geid ho folt that IIITH. FR's death was a grave blow to geriniry becouso ho was a strong man. The other sald thet, Fuhres or no Fuhror, ho would as a soldior hold out, if orderod to do so, as Iong as possible. Ho s messoc the immense conifdence placed in HIMTER wo was the most suiteite man to mastor a situation of such difPiculty as tha prosont. Thase officers appoarod to havo 11 tillo to say of Dovirz as a politicion on Ohiof of State. Thos rocarood him as a compotent professional sailor, with stronf comon sonco as his main cheractoristic.

The opinlons expressed by the $C$ ther Reaks interrogated producod the interesting fact that a very la:ce mad ortty considerod themsalvas no longer bound to their milltary oeth of loyalif to HITHER,
 doath mado no differenoe to thoir foolings obovit the war. As a loading political figuro von PAPEM dies hard. thouth perhaps the fact that both ho and INODEL Wero considerod es possiblo successors to HITESR morely bears tostimony to the scantiness of the news at present reaching the front lino troops.
